

## Division Accelerated Math and Accelerated Science Programs

### PROGRAM GOALS

The Accelerated Program is specifically designed for students who are academically capable of completing grade seven, eight, nine and ten Mathematics and/or Science in the three years of Junior High. It provides students with the opportunity to complete Math 10 Common and/or Science 10 in their Junior High school years and earn high school credits. Course requirements are rigorous, and students are commonly required to spend more time working outside of class than those students in the regular program.

### ADMISSION CRITERIA

1. Achieve an excellent\* score on the Entrance Exam(s) based on the Grade 6 Learner outcomes and those skill-based outcomes extending into the Grade 7 Math and/or Science skills-based curriculum learner outcomes.
2. The student will have **demonstrated overall “Exemplary” achievement in Math and/or Science in grade six** according to the most recent PowerSchool report or report card.
3. **A teacher evaluation** must be completed by the students' grade 6 teacher, which is found on the St. Rose website, under the Registration documents and information page, under the About tab.
4. A printout of the student's **current PowerSchool report or report card** must be submitted to the office. A strong report **will indicate not only academic ability, but also strong organization and work habits.**
5. Potential students require a mature, positive attitude, exemplary classroom behavior and the ability to work independently

Accelerated Math/Science teachers and the school administration will review each student's application. Based on the **ADMISSION CRITERIA**, the top students will be chosen for the program.

### CONTINUATION IN THE PROGRAM(S)

Student performance and program recommendations will be reviewed and made at each reporting period. In order to ensure a student meets the Program of Studies learning requirements, any decision to have a student discontinue in the program will be made at the end of the school year.

\*Overall test results vary from year to year; admission to the program is based on the individual student's performance compared to the rest of the cohort writing.

**Program Entrance Exam Dates:** Each exam takes between 45 – 60 minutes; however, a student may take up to 90 minutes (maximum) to write. All exams are written at St. Rose School. Students may write both the math and science exams in one session.

**Thursday, February 19 (2:00 p.m. start) or Saturday, February 21 (9:00 a.m. start)**
