7. Principal Report - Erin Winch

- Enrolment update 427 students (5 grade seven classes, 5 grade eight classes and 5 grade nine classes)
- New Staff

- FSLW supports focus on student mental health Belinda Griffin
- We had our first Meet the Family night in September. There was an excellent turnout and parents reported that they enjoyed the more informal opportunity to tour the school and build relationships.
- We welcomed the parish team from St. John the Evangelist on September 17 for our opening school celebration.
- Prime Minister Mark Carney visited September 10 to film a documentary about the impact of movies and tv on the Canadian culture hosted by George Stromboulopoulos.
- Grade 9 students travelled to Camp Nakamun on September 15 and 16.

- September 18 was the annual Terry Fox run through the community. We raised over \$1600.
- September 22 was the MADD presentation. Our students were excellent and very attentive during the presentation.
- St Rose PD Day focus on creating Culturally Diverse Classrooms in the morning and worked on collaborative assessments in the afternoon.

- In our school growth plan we have committed to focusing on acts of kindness and service. In our social justice projects we want to really highlight the "why" behind our actions. We also aim to permeate our faith more explicitly in all subject areas. Our commitment to learning excellence ensures optimal learning conditions for all students, fostering clarity, engagement, and high expectations. Each subject area will define non-negotiables to establish effective learning environments that support student success. To enhance visible learning, our instructional coach will work closely with teachers to refine teacher clarity, focusing on learning intentions, success criteria, and impactful feedback. Additionally, we will transition to common assessments for core subject areas, establishing consistency in major evaluations while maintaining high academic standards. Additionally, our math department will be implementing the new ECSD Math Framework to focus on the mathematical identity of our students and strategies for high-impact instruction. Also, Students and staff recognize and celebrate the unique gifts and talents of every member of their learning and working community. To foster this, we develop common understandings of EDIAR concepts and language from a Catholic worldview, ensuring inclusivity for students, staff, and families.
